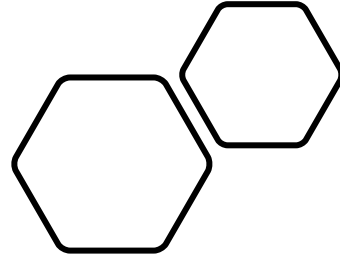




- There are Stages and Scales for Community Participation in Planning




Oscillate between structural power analysis:

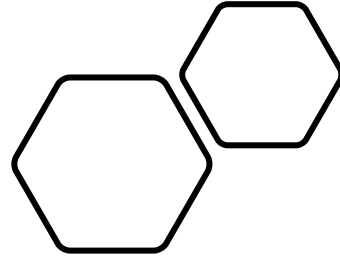

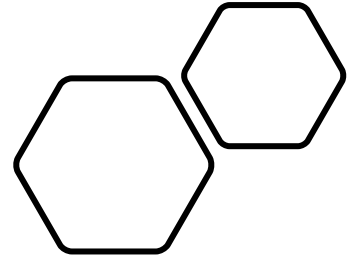

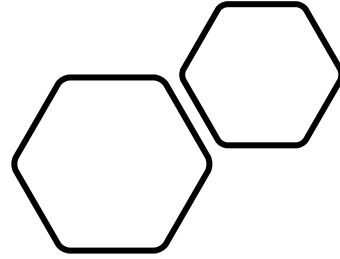
